



KILLING FOR FUN!



Did Japanese soldiers make these photographs? Read the letter at right. In it, W. A. Farmer, of Hankow, China, who sent them to LOOK, charges the Japanese with butchering Chinese and burying them alive, merely for amusement, or to inspire raw recruits to kill. He says Japanese made these pictures and sent them to Shanghai. From there, prints were smuggled to Hankow.

The Letter which accompanied these pictures is reproduced in part above.

Five Chinese Prisoners are Buried Alive in this, one of the most gruesome of all wartime pictures. Enraged by the stoic calm with which the Chinese defenders are meeting their attack, the Japanese are more determined than ever to bring them to their knees. This war, now in its third year, is one of the most brutal in history.
