

BERLIN, Dac. 22.—German and
Japaness engineers are now constructing in Fushun, Manchurla,
as plant to make fuel oil from
coal which will make the Japaness Navy entirely independent of
foreign supplies. The announcement appeared here today
in the Krupp Company's bimonthly journal.

Employing the Bergius formula
the plant will be in full operation
some time in 1933. A smaller plant
using a Japanese process was
constructed in the same district
in 1820.

announced. Krupps do, however,
announce that they are working
on asveral other Japanese contracts among them three cement
plants in Manchurla and Korea
which will produce 1,500 tons
daily.
